Claris CAD is a deceptive product. It is as easy to use as MacDraw, but MacDraw never had this kind of power, precision and flexibility. Claris even offers an inexpensive Claris CAD Starter Kit, for skeptics who'd like to try before they buy.

SuperPaint 2.0

SuperPaint is super, so what is SuperPaint 2.0? Other than faster, more flexible, more powerful and more fun, it is merely the best black and white paint package on the market.

Digital Darkroom

Many people have toyed with the idea of having a home darkroom, but didn't want to deal with the chemicals and mess. With Digital Darkroom, you can do image enhancement, retouching, and special effects, all without chemicals — or even a camera.

MacInTax

Hints and Suggestions – When I Print on a Laser, Everything Is Wrong

Q.: When I bring my documents in to be printed on a LaserWriter, everything seems to come out wrong. The fonts are changed, lines break in different places, things which were lined up in straight columns seem to be crooked, and even the page numbering is different. Is there something wrong with my Mac, or are all LaserWriters possessed?

A.: And the answer is — LaserWriters are possessed. With a few exceptions, laser printers connected to Macs use PostScript for printing. PostScript is a computer language designed for printing, and works differently than the technique used to form characters on the screen or on an ImageWriter. While the details are unimportant, you do need to follow these rules for best results:

• Create your document using the most current version of whatever software package you select. Old versions of MacWrite, in particular, are notorious for inaccurate laser printing.

• Use the Chooser desk accessory on your Mac to select LaserWriter, even if you don't have a LaserWriter.

• Write your document entirely in

LaserWriter fonts (Courier, Helvetica, Times, etc.)

• Use tabs to line up items, not spaces.

• Save the document on a disk, and take it in for printing. Little, if any, editing will be required.

New and Interesting Hardware

Abaton 300/S Scanner

Abaton's unique PanelScan software sets the 300/S apart from most other scanners. If you are in the middle of PageMaker, and would like to insert an illustration, PanelScan is immediately available as a control panel device, without leaving PageMaker. You can crop and preview your illustration and save it as a MacPaint file, a TIFF image, or as a gray-scale TIFF image, with 16 shades of gray.

Abaton InterFax

While other companies have had problems with their fax modems, Abarton's InterFax has compiled an enviable record of quality, reliability, and flexibility. Unlike most of its competitors, the InterFax can be used as both a fax and a standard modem, and can automatically send and receive faxes while the Mac is busy with other tasks neither MultiFinder nor special software are required. Virtually any Mac document, from a MacPaint file to a FileMaker database, can be "printed" to the InterFax as a fax document. Rated as a Group 3 fax, in actual practice the InterFax has proven faster at sending and receiving documents than any of the more expensive Group 4 fax modems on the market.

Kurta graphics tablet

Kurta is well known among graphics professionals for their high-quality graphics tablets. As one critic once commented, "drawing with a mouse is like drawing with a brick," but drawing with a Kurta tablet is as easy as using a pen. If you aren't much of an artist, the Kurta tablet will allow you to do something you've probably always wanted to do: trace a drawing. It's easy. And fun.

Sigma Designs PageView Monitor

With the PageView, you really can view an entire page at once, and at half the cost of similar monitors. Sigma Designs has models for the SE and the Mac II, and we have the SE model on display in our store. Stop by and see the big picture. Seikosha SP-1000AP Printer

Designed from the ground up to work with the Mac, the SP-1000AP is fully ImageWriter compatible, but at half the price. There are three things you don't get with this printer: 1) it doesn't offer color printing; 2) it makes far less noise than an ImageWriter II, 3) it doesn't reproduce the infamous ImageWriter II "hiccup" when printing starts, so your labels are less likely to jam inside.

Anchor 2400E Modem

Anchor is one of the top names in the modem business, and the 2400E may be their best value yet. It has a 5-year warranty, subscriptions to four of the most popular commercial database services, and a shopping list of features: full Hayes compatibility, auto dial/auto answer, 2400/1200/300 baud operation, and error correction. Translated into English, the 2400E is fast, flexible and easy to use.

Acoustic Research Speakers

Want to improve how your Mac sounds? Powered Partners plug into the external speaker jack, and the difference in sound quality is astonishing. Each Powered Partner includes its own amplifier, and delivers CD-quality audio (50-20,000 Hz with less than 1% total harmonic distortion). Music, game, and speech programs never sounded so good. Unlike most speakers, Powered Partners are specially shielded, and won't erase your diskettes.

Product Spotlight: Qume CrystalPrint Publisher LCD Printer

Qume is one of the oldest names in the computer printer field, but until recently they were virtually unknown in the Macintosh world. Then Qume started running ads claiming their CrystalPrint Publisher was better than the most popular Postscript printer on the market.

We were skeptical, so invited Oume to drop off one of their printers for a week of testing and torment. In their ads, Qume claims the CrystalPrint Publisher is over five times faster than a LaserWriter II NT, so we timed it - and found nothing to contradict this claim. Qume also claims the CrystalPrint Publisher is "Postscript

compatible," so we tried our best to find something which wouldn't print properly — and failed. Everything printed beautifully, and usually with a higher clarity and more crispness than our "genuine" Postscript printer.

CrystalPrint Publisher comes equipped with 35 typefaces, 3 megabytes of memory, and a special 32-bit RISC processor designed specifically for graphics printing. An AppleTalk interface is also included, and no special hardware or software is required for working with a Macintosh. Also included are Centronics parallel and RS-232C serial interfaces for use with other computers.


