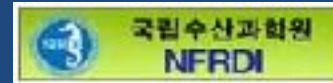

Social Business Power Map ²⁰¹⁰ for

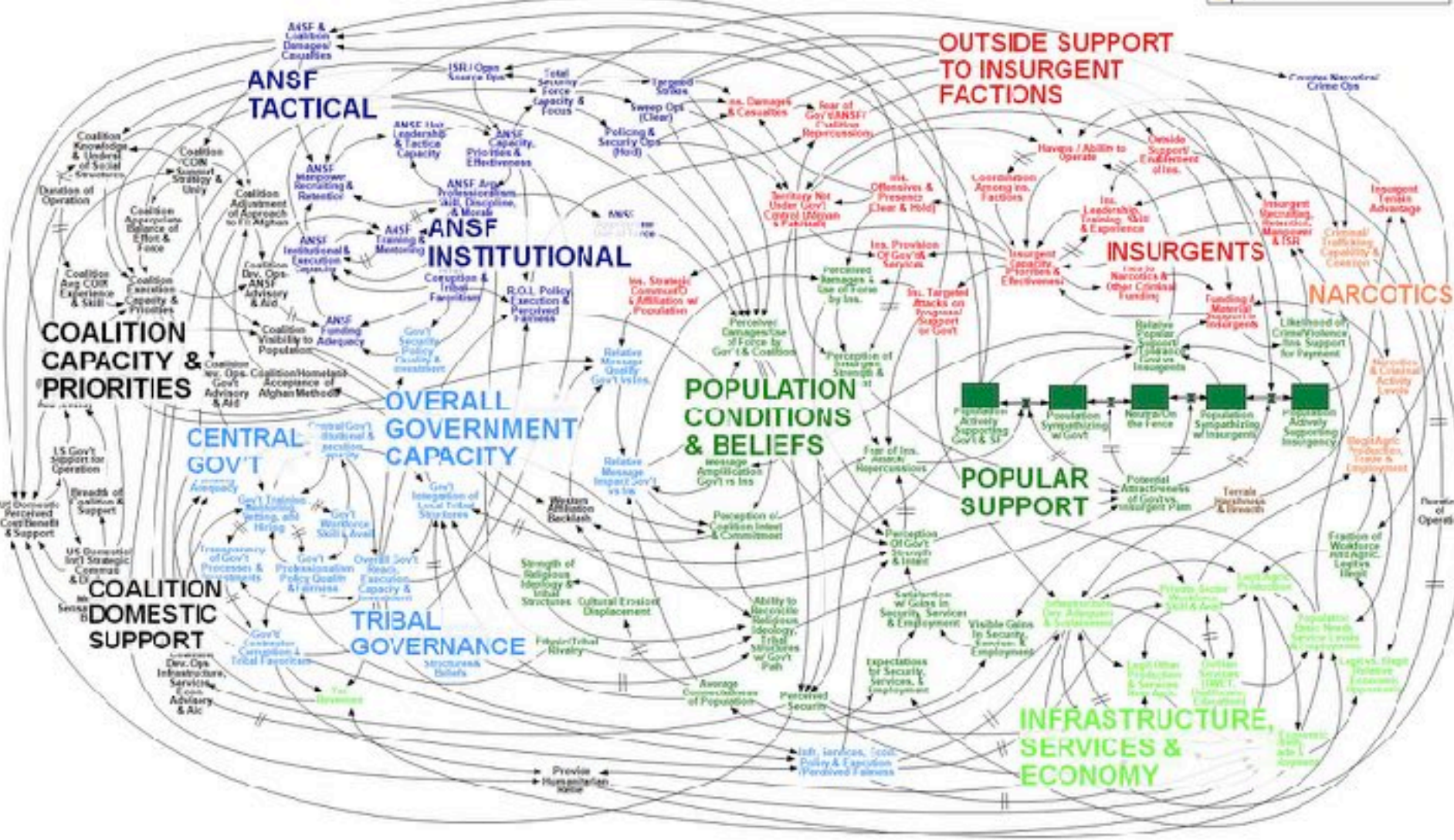

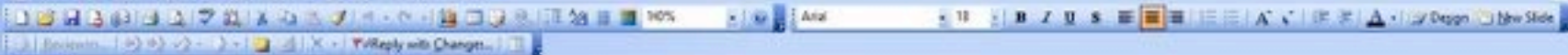

5. TRAIN AND WORK ASADS WITH THE UNIT THEY’LL SUPPORT ON DEPLOYMENTS.
6. DEVELOP A PUBLICATION EXPLAINING THE ROLE OF THE SAFETY SPECIALIST.

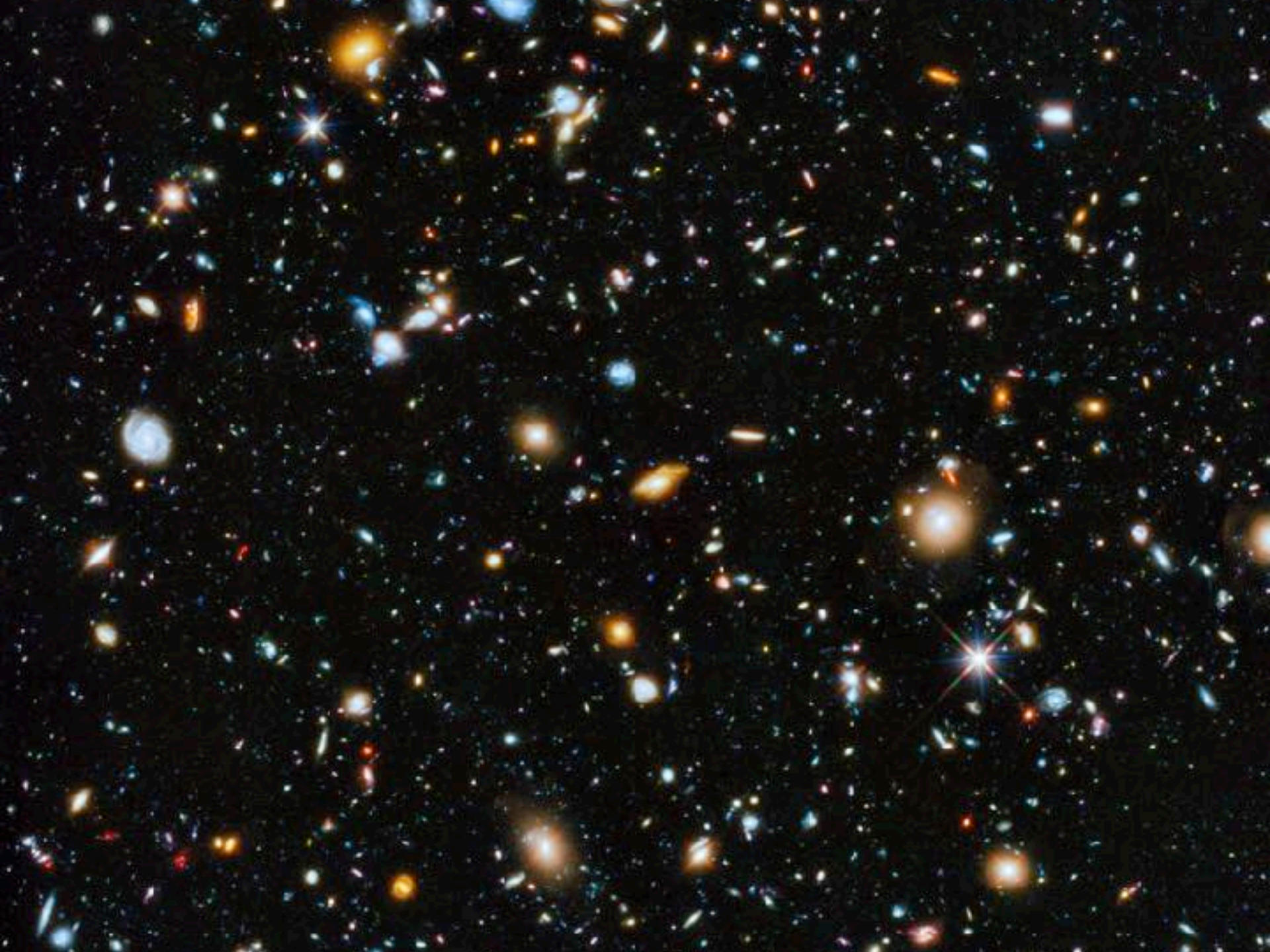
